### KIWI

<i>Actinidia arguta 'Issai'</i>	<b>Kiwi Vine</b> <i>A self fertile variety that has male and female plants grafted together. Needs a protected location; full sun. Zone 3</i>	1

### SASKATOONS

<i>Amelanchier alnifolia</i>	<b>Honeywood</b> <i>Dense compact habit; flowers are white and fruit is unusually sweet and mild-flavored. Zone 2a Ht 2m Sp 1.5m</i>	1 2
	<b>Martin</b> <i>Best tasting Saskatoon; ripening of the berries is very uniform, fruit is large. Zone 3 Ht 2m Sp 1.5m</i>	1 2
	<b>Northline</b> <i>Abundant sweet berries in June. Zone 2 Ht 3m Sp 2.15m</i>	1 2
	<b>Parkhill</b> <i>a medium-sized shrub that is commonly grown for its edible qualities, good for fresh eating, cooking, and preserves. Zone 2a Ht 1.5m Sp 1.5m</i>	1 2
	<b>Regent</b> <i>Delicious berries in June. Great for jams and pies. Zone 2 Ht 1.8m Sp 1.8m</i>	2
	<b>Smokey</b> <i>Large, fleshy, sweet berries, heavy producer. Zone 2 Ht 4m Sp 4m</i>	1 2
	<b>Thiessen</b> <i>Small plants with abundant medium berries; good flavour. Zone 2 Ht 2m Sp 1.5m</i>	1 2

### HONEYBERRY

<i>Lonicera edulis</i>	<b>Boreal Beast</b> <i>Remarkable for flavour when fresh or frozen. Upright Habit, mildew resistant. Zone 2 Ht .9-1.2m Sp .9-1.2m</i>	1 2

**Boreal Blizzrd** 1  
*Bigger berries, bigger plants, all with great flavour, harvest from early July into mid August. Boreal Blizzard is the earliest of the Boreal varieties with the largest fruit.* 2  
 Zone 2  
 Ht 1.2-1.8m Sp 1.2-1.8m

**Blue Moon** 1  
*Upright growth habit. Cold-hardy. Ripens in late May, early June. Best pollinator: Blue Velvet™.*  
 Zone 3  
 Ht .9-1.2m Sp .9-1.2m

**Blue Velvet** 1  
*Upright growth habit. Healthy plants can have a life span of up to 50 years! Cold-hardy. Ripens in late May, early June. Best pollinator: Blue Moon™.*  
 Zone 3  
 Ht .9-1.2m Sp .9-1.2m

**Borealis** 1  
*Very large fruit; sweet, tangy flavour. Zone 2* 2

**Tundra** 1  
*Firm, sweet tangy blue fruit; excellent for fresh eating, jams, jellies and wine. Zone 2* 2

**Honey Bee** 1  
*Large fruit, sweet. Will pollinate most other varieties of Haskap. Zone 2* 2

## GOJI BERRY

*Lycium barbarum* **Goji Berry (Wolf Berry)** 2  
*Tangy red fruit high in antioxidants; needs well drained soil. Zone 3*

## APPLES

**Malus x** **Combination** 7 grafted  
 4 varieties *Different varieties of apple grafted on one tree.* 10 grafted

**Fall Red** 5  
*An exceptionally hardy red apple, excellent for eating fresh, keeps well, mid harvest. Good for fresh eating and cooking. Zone 2*  
 Ht 5m Sp 4m

**Gemini** 7  
*Gemini Apple is a small tree. It produces chartreuse round apples with a red blush and white flesh which ripen in late summer to early fall. The apples have a sweet taste and a crisp texture. Zone 2*  
 Ht 4.5-5m Sp 4m

**Gloria** 7

*Medium sized red speckled fruit with a sweet and slightly spicy strawberry flavor. Great for fresh eating and cooking. Requires another apple within 150m (500') for pollination. Prefers a moist, well-drained soil. Zone 3  
Ht 4m Sp 4m*

**Goodland** 7

*Fruit creamy-green, washed red; good eating and cooking apple, keeps well.  
Zone 3  
Ht 5m Sp 4m*

**Hardi-Mac** 7

*Medium apple with bright red fruit that is crispy and juicy. This is a selection from the original McIntosh Apple. Zone 3  
Ht 5.2m Sp 3.8m*

**Honey Crisp** 7

*A large red apple. Very crisp and sweet; great for eating off the tree. Ripens late September. Zone 3B (almost 4)  
Ht 4.8m Sp 3.8m*

**Norland** 7

*A dwarf type hybrid apple. Fruit skin greenish yellow, striped dark red; flesh cream colour tinged green; good for eating or cooking; stores well.  
Zone 2  
Ht 5.2m Sp 3.8m*

**Norkent** 10

*A very hardy and juicy orange striped yellow apple, it is a medium-big size apple with an average 7cm diameter. The Norkent apple tastes similar to an apple-pear.  
Zone 2  
Ht 7m Sp 9m*

**Odyssey** 7

*Odyssey produces medium to large size fruit in late August. Fruit stores well into the New Year. The fruit is crisp and of excellent sweetness, comparable to Royal gala Apple. Zone 3a  
Ht 6.5-9.5m Sp 6.5-9.5m*

**Parkland** 7

*Hardy upright spreading tree; fruit red; flesh creamy white tinged green, ripens in August; stores well. Zone 2  
Ht 5.2m Sp 3.8m*

**Prairie Magic** 7

WB = Wire Basket, AMA = Amaroo Pot,  
TG/TW = Top Graft, STD = Standard,  
TF = Tree Form

*Produces medium-large size fruit in mid-September and is crisp and delicious.*

*Zone 3  
Ht 4.8m Sp 3.8m*

**Prairie Sensation** 7

*Large, excellent tasting apple with a fine balance of sweet and tart, ripen mid-late September. Zone 2  
Ht 4.8m Sp 3.8m*

**Red Sparkle** 7

*Medium size apple with nutty-fruity taste; ripens in September; good for cooking and eating. Zone 3*

**September Ruby** 7

*A very hardy red-streaked apple, good for eating fresh, keeps well. An excellent red apple, sweet and crisp. Zone 2  
Ht 4.5m Sp 3.6m*

**Zestar!** 10

*A Zestar!® Apple is sprightly sweet-tart taste with a hint of brown sugar. Zestar!® is juicy with a light, crisp texture. Maintains flavour in extended refrigeration. Harvest time is early. Excellent for fresh eating and cooking. Zone 3B  
Ht 5.2m Sp 4.2m*

## CRABAPPLE

*Malus x*

**Dolgo** 10

*Red fruit; crisp; juicy; good for jelly or cider. Zone 3  
Ht 6.5m Sp 6.5m*

**Kerr** 7

*Red skin; yellow flesh; firm, crisp, juicy, sweet; good for eating or jelly.  
Ht 4.8m Sp 4.8m*

**Rescue** 5

*Skin greenish yellow, washed and striped red; flesh yellowish-white, firm; flavor sweet and quality good. Zone 3a  
Ht 5.2m Sp 4.2m*

## CHERRIES

*Prunus cerasus*

**Evans** 7

*Hardy, sour cherry; bright red translucent fruit; high yield; self-pollinating. Zone 2  
Ht 3.2m Sp 1.8m*

**Prunus x kerrasis**

**Carmine Jewel** 7  
*Tart red cherries. Showy white flowers in spring and an upright rounded habit.* 10  
Zone 2  
Ht 3.2m Sp 2.3m

**Crimson Passion** 7  
*University of Saskatchewan introduction; bright red sweet cherries; high yielding; self-pollinating. Zone 2* 10  
Ht 3.2m Sp 2.3m

**Juliet** 2  
*Fruit is dark red with high sugar content; self-pollinating; excellent for eating fresh. Zone 2* 7  
Ht 3.2m Sp 2.3m 10

**Romeo** 7  
*Self-pollinating; good for processing; great for fresh eating. Zone 2* 10  
Ht 3.8m Sp 1.8m

**Valentine** 7  
*Medium red fruit; good for processing. Zone 2* 10  
Ht 3.2m Sp 1.8m

**Prunus tomentosa**

**Nanking Cherry** 2  
*A hardy sweet cherry. Flowers are white on pink. A great pollinator for all plum varieties. Zone 2* 5  
Ht 2.6m Sp 1.8m

**PLUMS**

**Prunus x**

**Bounty** 7  
*Dark red, egg shaped small fruit with orange-yellow flesh; good for preserves. Zone 3*  
Ht 7m Sp 4.8m

**Brookgold** 7  
*Golden yellow plum; fruit is freestone and very sweet; a good eating variety. Zone 3*  
Ht 4m Sp 3.5m

**Brookred** 7  
*Medium red plum; very good for eating and cooking. Zone 2*  
Ht 5.5m Sp 4.2m

**Opata** 7  
*Early plum with yellow fruit. Excellent producer and great pollinator. Zone 2a*  
Ht 4.5m Sp 3m

WB = Wire Basket, AMA = Amaroo Pot,  
TG/TW = Top Graft, STD = Standard,  
TF = Tree Form

**Pembina** 7  
*Early plum; fruit is red in colour, skin medium thick; flesh is yellow and juicy; sweet flavor, good dessert quality. Zone 2*  
Ht 5.4m Sp 4.2m

**Tecumseh** 7  
*Medium deep purple-blue fruit. Good for fresh eating or jams and jellies. Ripens in September. Requires a pollinator. Zone 3*  
Ht 4.5m Sp 2.5m

**Mount Royal** 5  
*Loads of tasty blue prune-plums in late summer. Good for baking. Needs pollinator. Zone 2* 10  
Ht 4m Sp 2.5m

**Combination** 7  
*Multiple varieties of plum budded on one tree. Pollination takes between varieties.* 10  
Ht 4.5m Sp 4.5m

## PEARS

**Pyrus x**  
**Early Golden** 7  
*Improved Ure; large yellow fruit, sweet and juicy. Zone 2* 10  
Ht 3-6m Sp 3-6m

**Golden Spice** 10  
*Very hardy vigorous grower; profusion of small fruits. Zone 3*  
Ht 3-6m Sp 3-6m

**Ure** 7  
*Large fruit good for eating fresh or canning. Zone 3*  
Ht 6-9m Sp 3-6m

**Combination** 7  
*Multiple varieties of pear budded on one tree. Pollination take place between the varieties.* 10

## RHUBARB

**Rheum**  
**Canada Red** 1  
*Bright red stalk. Excellent for pies, jelly or wine*

## RASPBERRY

**Rubus idaeus**  
**Boyne** 1  
*An excellent Raspberry with large dark red fruit in early July. Zone 2* 2

**Double Delight** 1  
*Produces fruit on new growth from August to freeze-up. Excellent flavor. Zone 3a* 2

WB = Wire Basket, AMA = Amaroo Pot,  
TG/TW = Top Graft, STD = Standard,  
TF = Tree Form

**Fall Gold** 1  
*Yellow-gold sweet fruit; excellent for eating fresh, preserves, canning. Zone 3a* 2

**Heritage** 1  
*This hardy raspberry has medium-large, sweet, red fruit. Zone 2* 2

## FRUITING CURRANTS & GOOSEBERRIES

**Pixwell Red Gooseberry** 2  
*Large juicy red fruit, great for jam and pies Zone 3*

**Ribes hinnomaki** **Hinnomaki Yellow** 2  
*Large yellow golden fruit with sweet flesh and tangy skin. Exceptional yield. Very thorny. Ht 1.2m Sp 1.5m*

**Hinnomaki Red** 2  
*Tart skin covers these sweet ruby berries. High yield. Zone 3 Ht 1.2m Sp 1.2m*

**Ribes oxycanthoides** **Jahn's Prairie Gooseberry** 2  
*Alberta selection. Self-pollinating with white, mid-spring blooms maturing to red-pink berries. High yielding and reliable crops. Excellent for jams, jellies and desserts. Zone 3*

**Ribes nigrum** **Consort** 2  
*Medium sized shrub. Tart black berries in summer. Excellent for jams. Zone 3 Ht 1.2m Sp .9m*

**Ribes triste** **Red Lake Currant** 2  
*Large red berries in clusters. Great for jams and jellies. Zone 3*

## BLUEBERRIES

**Vaccinium** **Chippewa** 2  
*Compact habit; huge crops of large, sweet light blue fruit. Zone 3*

**Northblue** 2  
*Very hardy hybrid blueberry. Produces bumper crops of tasty, sweet blue fruit mid summer. Zone 3 Ht .6m Sp .9m*

**North Country** 2  
*Early to mid-season; plants larger and more productive than North Sky, fruit 1/2" in diameter with attractive sky blue colour; flavor sweet and mild. Zone 3*

WB = Wire Basket, AMA = Amaroo Pot,  
TG/TW = Top Graft, STD = Standard,  
TF = Tree Form

**Northland** 2  
*Hardest high bush blueberry. Sweet dark blue fruit in early summer. Zone 3  
Ht 1.2m Sp .9m*

**North Sky** 2  
*Dwarf bush and dark green foliage; mid season fruit medium size and good flavor. Zone 3*

**Polaris** 2  
*Upright spreading habit; tangy sweet light blue fruit. Zone 3*

## LINGONBERRY

**Vaccinium vitis-idaea** **Lingonberry/Cow Berry** 1  
*An evergreen shrub spread by underground rhizomes making it a very good ground cover or continuous border. It is low growing and blooms only in the spring. Zone 2  
Ht .3-.45m Sp varies*

## GRAPE VINE

**Vitis** **Beta** 1  
*Extremely vigorous vine; produces large clusters of red/purple fruit. Good eating as juice or jelly. Zone 3*

**Combination** 5  
*Multiple varieties budded on stem.*

**Valiant** 1  
*Vine with hardy, vigorous purple-blue grapes. Needs sunny location. Zone 2*

**Frontenac Gris** 1  
*A newer wine grape that's gaining popularity, produces an abundance of large aromatic fruit in fall, excellent for red wine or juice. Zone 4*

**Minnesota** 1  
*An exciting new red wine grape from the University of Minnesota, produces an aromatic deep red wine. Zone 3*

**Marquette** 1  
*A descendant of Pinot Noir. Abundant clusters of seeded blue-black fruits ripen in September - tart until fully ripe. Use as a screen or for shade with support. Zone 3*
