<b>Acer ginnala</b>	<b>Flame Amur Maple</b> <i>Very hardy; small, dense form; yellowish-white fragrant flowers in spring; fiery red fall colour; slow grower Ht 5m Sp 4m</i>	<b>10</b> <b>15</b>
<b>Acer pseudosieboldianum</b>	<b>Korean Maple</b> <i>An ideal substitute for the coveted Japanese maples where they are not hardy, with similiary fingered leaves, attractive tiered growth habit and shocking fall colors of yellow, orange, scarlet and red; does best in cool, moist conditions. <b>Acer rubrum</b>	<b>Autumn Spire</b> <i>Upright oval form, early bright red fall colour Ht 10m Sp 6m</i>	<b>15</b>
	<b>Northwood Red Maple</b> <i>Dark burgundy foliage turning red in the fall. Needs heavy watering. Ht 5m Sp 4m</i>	<b>15</b>
	<b>Red Rocket</b> <i>Narrow upright habit. Bright red fall colour. One of the most cold hardy cultivars. Ht 9m Sp 4.5m</i>	<b>15</b>
	<b>Scarlet Jewel Red Maple</b> <i>Dense foliage in an upright bread form. Foliage turns scarlet two weeks before other maples. Prefers slightly acidic, well-drained, moist soil. Great frost crack resistance. Ht 18-20m Sp 8-9m</i>	<b>15</b>
<b>Acer saccharinum</b> NEW 2021	<b>Silver Cloud Maple</b> <i>Has attractive green foliage with silver undersides throughout the season. The lobed leaves are highly ornamental and turn buttery yellow in fall. Ht 15.2m Sp 10.3m</i>	<b>15</b>
<b>Acer saccharum</b>	<b>Fall Fiesta Sugar Maple</b> <i>Outstanding upright selection. Vibrant fall colour. Thick Leathery deep green foliage. Ht 12m+ Sp 6m+</i>	<b>15</b>
	<b>Inferno Sugar Maple</b>	<b>15</b>

## OHIO BUCKEYE

**Aesculus glabra**                      **Ohio Buckeye**                      **15**  
*Features showy spikes of creamy white flowers rising above the foliage in mid spring. It has dark green foliage which emerges light green in spring. The palmate leaves turn an outstanding coppery-bronze in the fall. The fruit is not ornamentally significant.

**Aesculus x arnoldiana**                      **Autumn Splendor Buckeye**                      **15**  
*Features showy spikes of creamy white flowers rising above the foliage in mid spring. It has dark green foliage throughout the season. The palmate leaves turn an outstanding tomato-orange in the fall.

**Aesculus x carnea**                      **Fort McNair Horse Chestnut**                      **15**  
*Features bold spikes of pink flowers with yellow eyes rising above the foliage in mid spring. It has dark green foliage which emerges light green in spring. The palmate leaves turn yellow in fall.

## BIRCH

**Betula laciniata**                      **Cutleaf Weeping Birch**                      **15**  
*Graceful weeping tree; attractive white bark; delicate cut leaf dark green foliage.

**Betula papyrifera**                      **Prairie Dream Paper Birch**                      **15**                      **single**  
*Single stem; loosely pyramidal to rounded in shape; bark becomes chalky white with age.

**Betula platyphylla**                      **Dakota Pinnacle Birch**                      **10**  
*A narrow, upright Birch with snow-white bark. This birch is resistant to the Bronze Birch Borer.

*Shiny bright green leaves; double flowers are fragrant, white to faintly pink initially, changing to deep rose; fruit is sparse and bright red.

## ASH

<b>Fraxinus nigra</b>	<b>Fallgold Black Ash</b>	<b>15</b>
	<i>Attractive hardy uniform upright tree. Long lasting golden yellow Fall Colour. Adaptable to a wide range of soils. Drought tolerant once established Ht 12m Sp 6.5m</i>	

<b>Fraxinus pennsylvanica</b>	<b>Prairie Spire Ash</b>	<b>15</b>
	<i>Glossy deep green foliage; excellent pyramidal form. Ht 10m Sp 8m</i>	

	<b>Trojan Green Ash</b>	<b>15</b>
	<i>Excellent shade for smaller sites due to its very upright, compact, narrow form. Shiny green foliage turns yellow in fall. Ht 12-15m Sp 6-8m</i>	

## MAIDEN HAIR TREE

<b>Gingko biloba</b>	<b>Autumn Gold Maidenhair Tree</b>	<b>15</b>
	<i>Unique fan shaped green foliage turns golden yellowing fall. Fruitless with symmetrical branching and an upright habit. Slow growing. Ht 10m+ Sp 10m+</i>	

## BUTTERNUT

<b>Juglans cinera</b>	<b>Butternut Tree</b>	<b>10</b>
	<i>A large shade tree with long clusters of white blooms in spring and edible nuts. Very hardy, prefers well-drained moist soil, but tolerates sandy acidic soils. Ht 12-18m Sp 12-18m</i>	<b>15</b>

## MAACKIA

<b>Maackii amurensis</b>	<b>Summerfrost Amur Mackia</b>	<b>15</b>
	<i>Attractive rare small tree. Showy upright spikes of white flowers in mid summer. Ash-like foliage emerges to a fuzzy silver. Glowing golden bark. Ht 6m Sp 7.5m</i>	

## FLOWERING CRABAPPLE

<b>Malus x astringens</b>	<b>Big River</b>	<b>15</b>
	<i>Dark bark, bronze foliage; stunning red flowers in spring; crimson fruit. Ht 6m Sp 5m</i>

*An upright, columnar tree with purple-bronze foliage, and masses of pink blooms in spring.

*A narrow accent tree that fits today's smaller yards. Bright pink spring blossoms cover the plant from top to bottom. Glossy purple foliage lasts all season. Small purplish fruit.  
Ht 1.5-3.1m Sp .6-.9m*

**Emerald Spire** 10

*Dwarf Columnar habit. Pink flowers, red fruit. Disease free foliage.  
Ht 5m Sp 3m*

**Gladiator** 15

*Narrowly upright to columnar ornamental tree; showy pink flowers followed by smallish purple fruit and rich burgundy-purple leaves.  
Ht 7m Sp 3m*

**Green Wall** 10

*This columnar cultivar offers outstanding glossy, green foliage and abundant white spring flowers. Tiny red fruit attract birds and provide winter landscape value.

**Makamik** 15

*Flowers deep rosy red. Bronze foliage. Very hardy

**Midnight Spire** 7

*The newest cultivar in the columnar Spire series, Midnite Spire offers outstanding glossy, purple foliage all summer long. Pink spring flowers give rise to medium sized fruit.

*Reddish purple glossy foliage turns orangey yellowing fall. Dark red flowers. Beautiful specimen tree.

*Clear red flowers; glossy bronze foliage.

*Excellent display of white flowers in spring. Dense upright oval crown; bright green leaves. Minimal amounts of fruit.

*Covered in snowy white blooms in spring with dark green leaves; fruit is bright red, small and does not drop; very cold hardy.  
Ht 5m Sp 4m*

*Rose coloured blooms; dark copper bronze leaves

*Introduced from Sweden; pyramidal form of Populus tremula; shiny green toothed leaves; good autumn colour.

<b>Prunus padus</b>	<b>Sweetheart Mayday</b> <i>An upright, uniform mayday with clusters of pink blooms and red/purple foliage. Ht 5m Sp 3-4m</i>	<b>15</b>
	<b>Mayday</b> <i>Medium sized accent tree. Covered with showy white flowers in spring. Ht 6m Sp 2.5m</i>	<b>15</b>
<b>Prunus virginiana</b>	<b>Bailey Select Schubert Chokecherry</b> <i>A handsome upright form; foliage is deep purple, staying that colour through fall. Ht 8m Sp 4m</i>	<b>15</b>

<b>Quercus ellipsoidalis</b>	<b>Majestic Sky Northern Pin Oak</b> <i>Large ornamental street tree with rich glossy green lobed foliage; turn red in fall. Ht 15.79m Sp 12m</i>	<b>15</b>
<b>Quercus macrocarpa</b>	<b>Top Gun Bur Oak</b> <i>Narrow, upright variety with large dark green lobed foliage with a grey underside. Corky bark. Drought resistant. Ht 12m+ Sp 5.5m+</i>	<b>10</b>
