	<i>A dense multi-stemmed evergreen shrub with a narrowly upright and columnar growth habit. Its relatively fine texture sets it apart from other landscape plants with less refined foliage. Ht 4.6m Sp 2.4m</i>	
	<b>Blue Mound Swiss Stone Pine</b>	<b>2</b>
Pinus mugo	<i>A tight conical shape with nice silver-blue needles, slow growing, low mounding habit. Rock garden gem! Ht 1m Sp 0.6m</i>	
	<b>Lodgepole Pine</b>	<b>10</b>
	<i>Thin barked with a straight narrow crown, yellow-grey scaly bark and green-yellow needles. Ht 12-25m Sp 6m</i>	
	<b>Columnar Mugo Pine</b>	<b>10</b>
<i>A narrow upright tree with reddish-orange bark. Good for tight areas. Ht 3m Sp 1.2m</i>		
Pinus mugo	<b>Big Tuna Mugo Pine</b>	<b>5</b>
	<i>This mugo pine forms a dense, dark green screen. Ht 3m Sp 2m</i>	<b>10</b>
	<b>Dwarf Mugo Pine</b>	<b>2</b>
	<i>Needles dark green; oval to round shape. Prune the "candles" in spring to keep compact form. Ht 1.5m Sp 1.5m</i>	<b>5</b>

<i>A very uniform, dense, rounded habit. Little or no shearing needed. Great for rock gardens. Ht 63cm Sp 1m</i>

	<i>Extremely slow-growing miniature mugo pine that is a dense, tiny, bun-shaped conifer. Looks like a mound of moss. Ht 15cm Sp 25cm</i>

<b>Pinus strobus</b>	<b>Eastern White Pine</b>	<b>15</b>	
	<i>A rapid-growing, long-lived, needled evergreen tree Easily grown in acidic, medium moisture, well-drained soil in full sun. Prefers fertile soils and cool, humid climates. Intolerant of compacted, clayey soils, alkaline conditions, and many air pollutants such as sulfur dioxide and ozone. Ht 16m Sp 6.5m</i>

*Dense multi-stemmed evergreen shrub with a more or less rounded form, needles are highly ornamental and remain bluish-green throughout the winter  
Ht 1.8m Sp 1.8m*

**Green Penguin Scots Pine** 5 10

*Great replacement for those having trouble growing Dwarf Alberta Spruce! Much hardier with a very compact, pyramidal form & bright green foliage. Grows less than 10cm a year. Drought tolerant once established in a moist, well-drained soil.

**Pinus sylvestris 'Waterii'** **Topiary Wateri Scots Pine** 20

*A specialty evergreen; faster growing with a broad pyramidal shape and cinnamon brown bark. Best in full sun. Maintained in topiary will grow to:  
Ht 1.8-4.5m Sp 1.2-2.4m*

**Pinus uncinata** **Mountain Pine** 10

*Larger cones 5 to 7cm; a dense, broadly conical tree creates shelter against cold winds.  
Ht 4m Sp 3m*

**Taxus x media Densiformis** **Anglo-Japanese Yew** 2

*semi-dwarf, evergreen shrub of rounded habit when young and spreading with age, prefers shade  
Ht 1.5m Sp .9m*

*Dark green foliage. Grown in part to full shade.  
Toxic if ingested.
