	<i>Very hardy; small, dense form; yellowish-white fragrant flowers in spring; fiery red fall colour; slow grower Ht 5m Sp 4m</i>	
<i>Acer platanoides</i>	<b>Prairie Splendor Norway Maple</b>	15
	<i>Oval structure with bright maroon red lobed foliage. Ht 9m Sp 6m+</i>	
<i>Acer rubrum</i>	<b>Autumn Spire</b>	15
	<i>Upright oval form, early bright red fall colour Ht 10m Sp 6m</i>	
	<b>Northwood Red Maple</b>	15
	<i>Dark burgundy foliage turning red in the fall. Needs heavy watering. Ht 5m Sp 4m</i>	
	<b>Red Rocket</b>	15
	<i>Narrow upright habit. Bright red fall colour. One of the most cold hardy cultivars. Ht 9m Sp 4.5m</i>	
	<b>Scarlet Jewel Red Maple</b>	15
	<i>Dense foliage in an upright bread form. Foliage turns scarlet two weeks before other maples. Prefers slightly acidic, well-drained, moist soil. Great frost crack resistance. Ht 18-20m Sp 8-9m</i>	
<i>Acer saccharum</i>	<b>Fall Fiesta Sugar Maple</b>	15
	<i>Outstanding upright selection. Vibrant fall colour. Thick Leathery deep green foliage. Ht 12m+ Sp 6m+</i>	
<i>Acer tartaricum</i>	<b>Hot Wings</b>	15
	<i>Blazing red seed pods in late summer; fiery red fall colour. Ht 5m Sp 4m</i>	

### BIRCH

<i>Betula laciniata</i>	<b>Cutleaf Weeping Birch</b>	15
	<i>Graceful weeping tree; attractive white bark; delicate cut leaf dark green foliage. Ht 12m Sp 8m</i>	

<b>Betula papyrifera</b>	<b>Prairie Dream Paper Birch</b> <i>Single stem; loosely pyramidal to rounded in shape; bark becomes chalky white with age. Ht 15.79m Sp 4m</i>	<b>15</b>	<b>single</b>
	<b>Dakota Pinnacle Birch</b> <i>A narrow, upright Birch with snow-white bark. This birch is resistant to the Bronze Birch Borer. Ht 10m Sp 6m</i>	<b>10</b>	<b>15</b>
	<b>Parkland Pillar Birch</b> <i>A narrow dense, columnar tree. The foliage is dark green in summer and golden in fall. Makes a great privacy screen. Drought tolerant once established. Ht 7-8m Sp 1.5m</i>	<b>15</b>	

## CARAGANA

<b>Caragana arborescens</b>	<b>Sutherland Caragana</b> <i>Extremely hardy and drought tolerant; upright form; branches lined with profusion of bright yellow flowers in late spring; fast growing Ht 5m Sp 1m</i>	<b>10</b>	
<b>Caragana arborescens 'Pendula'</b>	<b>Weeping Caragana</b> <i>A stiffly branched pendulous very small tree; older branches slowly take on a gnarled appearance; yellow flowers in spring, a contrast with the apple green foliage. Ht varied Sp 1m</i>	<b>10</b>	<b>TG</b>
	<b>Walker's Weeping Caragana</b> <i>Stiffly branched, very small tree with fine foliage which resembles asparagus fern; yellow flowers in spring. Ht varied Sp 1m</i>	<b>10</b>	<b>TG</b>

<b>Carpinus caorliniana</b>	<b>Blue Beech</b> <i>Muscle like ridges on a smooth-grey trunk. Bluish - green foliage with fine teeth. Ht 8m Sp 6m</i>	<b>10</b>

## HAWTHORN

<b>Crataegus x mordenensis</b>	<b>Snowbird Hawthorn</b> <i>Double white flowers; leaves are dark green, lobed with serrated edges; bright crimson fruit produced sparingly. Ht 5m Sp 4m</i>	<b>15</b>	
	<b>Toba Hawthorn</b> <i>Shiny bright green leaves; double flowers are fragrant, white to faintly pink initially, changing to deep rose; fruit is sparse and bright red. Ht 5m Sp 4m</i>	<b>15</b>

<b>Eleagnus angustifolia</b>	<b>Russian Olive</b> <i>Tree with small aromatic yellow flowers in spring; narrow silver leaves; good plant for windbreak</i> Ht 6m Sp 5m	15 25	AMA

### ASH

<b>Fraxinus pennsylvanica</b>	<b>Prairie Spire Ash</b> Glossy deep green foliage; excellent pyramidal form. Ht 10m Sp 8m	15
	<b>Trojan Green Ash</b> Excellent shade for smaller sites due to its very upright, compact, narrow form. Shiny green foliage turns yellow in fall. Ht 12-15m Sp 6-8m	15

### MAIDEN HAIR TREE

<b>Ginkgo biloba</b>	<b>Autumn Gold Maidenhair Tree</b> Unique fan shaped green foliage turns golden yellowing fall. Fruitless with symmetrical branching and an upright habit. Slow growing. Ht 10m+ Sp 10m+	10

<b>Juglans cinera</b>	<b>Butternut Tree</b> A large shade tree with long clusters of white blooms in spring and edible nuts. Very hardy, prefers well-drained moist soil, but tolerates sandy acidic soils. Ht 12-18m Sp 12-18m	10

<b>Maackii amurensis</b>	<b>Summerfrost Amur Mackia</b> Attractive rare small tree. Showy upright spikes of white flowers in mid summer. Ash-like foliage emerges to a fuzzy silver. Glowing golden bark. Ht 6m Sp 7.5m	10

### FLOWERING CRABAPPLE

<b>Malus x astringens</b>	<b>Big River</b> Dark bark, bronze foliage; stunning red flowers in spring; crimson fruit. Ht 6m Sp 5m	15
	<b>Courageous</b> An upright, columnar tree with purple-bronze foliage, and masses of pink blooms in spring. Ht 6m Sp 3m	15
	<b>Emerald Spire</b> Dwarf Columnar habit. Pink flowers, red fruit. Disease free foliage. Ht 5m Sp 3m	15
	<b>Gladiator</b>	15

*Narrowly upright to columnar ornamental tree; showy pink flowers followed by smallish purple fruit and rich burgundy-purple leaves. Ht 7m Sp 3m*

*Flowers deep rosy red. Bronze foliage. Very hardy

**Purple Spire** 15

*Narrow columnar, slow growing form; excellent for screening; burgundy-purple foliage; pink blooms in spring.  
Ht 5m Sp 2m*

**Rosthern** 10

*White flowers; columnar habit; red fruit.  
Ht 5m Sp 4m*

**Royal Beauty** 10

*Weeping variety with purple foliage. Showy bright pink flowers in spring.  
Ht Varies with graft height*

**Royal Gem** 10

*Dwarf compact, upright angular growth. Crimson coloured new foliage that turns dark green. Single rose red blooms.  
Ht 2m Sp 2m*

**Royal Raindrops** 15

*Vibrant pink-red spring flowers. Showy red fruit with unique cut-leaf foliage emerges wine red colour.  
Ht 4.8m Sp 4m*

**Royalty** 15

*Reddish purple glossy foliage turns orangey yellowing fall. Dark red flowers. Beautiful specimen tree.  
Ht 5m Sp 5m*

**Rudolph** 15

*Clear red flowers; glossy bronze foliage.  
Ht 6m Sp 5m*

**Spring Snow** 15

*Excellent display of white flowers in spring. Dense upright oval crown; bright green leaves. Minimal amounts of fruit.  
Ht 5m Sp 3m*

**Starlite** 25

*Covered in snowy white blooms in spring with dark green leaves; fruit is bright red, small and does not drop; very cold hardy.  
Ht 5m Sp 4m*

## POPLAR

**Populus tremula 'Erecta'** **Swedish Aspen Poplar** 5  
*Introduced from Sweden; pyramidal form of* 7  
*Populus tremula; shiny green toothed leaves; good* 10  
*autumn colour.* 15  
*Ht 12m Sp 2m*

**Populus tremuloides 'JFS Column'** **Mountain Sentinel** N/A  
*A narrow upright privacy screen tree. Green foliage*  
*in summer, golden in fall.*  
*Ht 9-12m Sp 1.5m*

## FLOWERING CHERRY & PLUM

**Prunus maackii** **Goldrush Amur Cherry** N/A  
*Hardy rounded dense tree; flowers are white and*  
*appear in April or May; flaky bark is bronzy yellow*  
*Ht 8m Sp 8m*

**Gold Spur Amur Cherry** 10  
*Dwarf selection. Unique dark green foliage. White*  
*flowers. Resistant to black knot.*  
*Ht 4.5m Sp 3m*

**Ming Cherry** 20  
*Dwarf accent tree with uniform upright growth.*  
*White flowers in spring and good fall colour.*  
*Reddish-bronze bark.*  
*Ht 5.5m Sp 3m*

**Prunus nigra** **Princess Kay Plum** 15  
*Narrow ornamental plum with fluffy double white*  
*spring blooms; small yellow-red ornamental fruit.*  
*Ht 5m Sp 3m*

**Prunus x nigrella** **Muckle Plum** 15  
*Bold rich pink fragrant blooms in spring*  
*Ht 4m Sp 3m*

**Prunus pennsylvanica** **Pincherry** 15  
*Oval shaped with reddish bark and white blooms in*  
*spring. Orange leaves and edible red berries in fall.*  
*Prefers well-drained soil.*  
*Ht 5m Sp 3m*

**Prunus padus** **Sweetheart Mayday** 15  
*An upright, uniform mayday with clusters of pink*  
*blooms and red/purple foliage.*  
*Ht 5m Sp 3-4m*

*Medium sized accent tree. Covered with showy white flowers in spring.  
Ht 6m Sp 2.5m*

**Prunus virginiana**      **Midnight Schubert Chokecherry**      **15**  
*A handsome upright form; foliage is deep purple, staying that colour through fall.  
Ht 8m Sp 4m*

## OAK

**Quercus ellipsoidalis**      **Majestic Sky Northern Pin Oak**      **15**  
*Large ornamental street tree with rich glossy green lobed foliage; turn red in fall.  
Ht 15.79m Sp 12m*

**Quercus macrocarpa**      **Top Gun Bur Oak**      **10**  
*Narrow, upright variety with large dark green lobed foliage with a grey underside. Corky bark. Drought resistant.  
Ht 12m+ Sp 5.5m+*

**Quercus xwarei**      **Regal Prince Oak**      **10**  
*Tall symmetrical narrowly oval habit. Ideal shade tree.  
Ht 12m Sp 4.5m*

## WILLOW

**Salix**      **Northern Fountain Weeping**      **5**  
*Weeping variety. Bright golden - yellow young branches with long green foliage. Fast growing.  
Ht 10m Sp 6m*

**Salix alba siberica**      **Silver Leaf Willow**      **N/A**  
*Silver leaves on fast growing oval canopy; prefers moist sites.  
Ht 10m Sp 10m*

**Salix caprea**      **Weeping Pussy Willow**      **5**  
*Weeping accent shrub, Large fuzzy catkins, showy in late winter.  
Ht 1.8m Sp 2.4m*

**Salix pentandra**      **Laurel-leaf Willow**      **N/A**  
*Upright rounded; foliage shiny green with golden yellow autumn colour, excellent for quick screen.  
Ht 10m Sp 10m*

**Prairie Cascade Willow**      **N/A**  
*Weeping habit with golden stem; the only hardy weeping willow for this area. Must be planted in a wet location.  
Ht 5m Sp 5m*

## MOUNTAIN ASH

**Sorbus americana decora**      **Showy Mountain Ash**      **15**  
*White flowers in spring; large clusters of red berries Ht 7m Sp 5m*

<b>Sorbus aucuparia</b>	<b>Russian Mountain Ash</b> <i>A large columnar tree with bright orange/red berries</i> <i>Ht 8m Sp 3-4m</i>	<b>15</b>
	<b>Luxor Pyramidal Mountain Ash</b> <i>Dense columnar branching habit. Clusters of white flowers in spring. Bright orange berries. Foliage turns red in fall.</i> <i>Ht 6m Sp 4.5m</i>	<b>15</b>
	<b>Columnar Mountain Ash</b> <i>Narrow columnar accent tree. Clusters of white flowers in spring followed by red berries into winter. Foliage turns red in fall.</i> <i>Ht 6m Sp 2.15m</i>	<b>10</b>

## JAPANESE LILAC

<b>Syringa reticulata</b>	<b>Ivory Silk Tree Lilac</b> <i>An oval shaped, compact tree with enormous clusters of creamy-white flowers in late spring.</i> <i>Ht 5m Sp 4m</i>	<b>15</b>
	<b>Snowdance Japanese Lilac</b> <i>Fragrant creamy white panicles bloom in June. Sterile variety.</i> <i>Ht 4.5m Sp 4.5m</i>	<b>20</b>

## LINDEN

<b>Tilia x flavescens</b>	<b>Dropmore Linden</b> <i>Upright dense compact crown. Dark green heart shaped leaves, clusters of fragrant pale yellow in summer. Very hardy.</i> <i>Ht 12m Sp 6m</i>	<b>15</b>
<b>Tilia x flavescens</b>	<b>Columnar Dropmore Linden</b> <i>Upright dense compact crown. Dark green heart shaped leaves, clusters of fragrant pale yellow in summer. Very hardy.</i> <i>Ht 12m Sp 4m</i>	<b>N/A</b>
<b>Tilia mongolica</b>	<b>Harvest Gold Linden</b> <i>Excellent shade tree. Fragrant yellow flowers. Interesting lobed toothed leaves turn a stunning gold in fall.</i> <i>Ht 10.5m Sp 6m</i>	<b>15</b>
<b>Tilia cordata</b>	<b>Redmond</b> <i>The largest leaves of all the Lindens with dense foliage, and glossy green leaves.</i> <i>Ht 15-21m Sp 9-13m</i>	<b>15</b>
